7. Classify the following numbers into triangular, square, virahanka number:

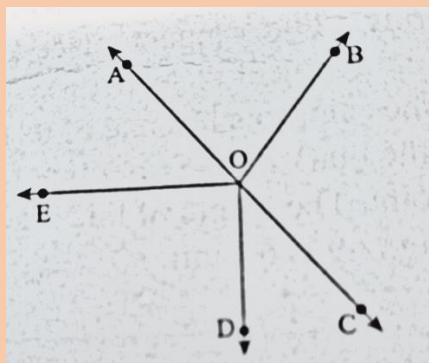

e) 180° f) 360° g) 310° h) 91° i) 89°

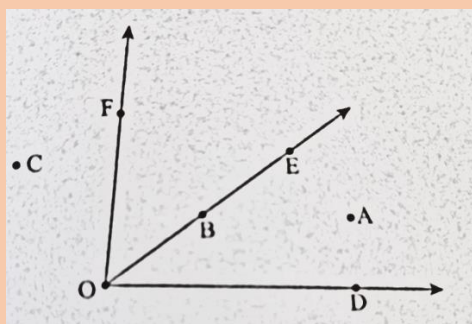
12. Draw two open curves and two closed curves.
